Dr Ockert Botha - Paramyxovirus and Avian Influenza Virus

- Dr Botha will do a presentation regarding the vaccination proses at the nest AGM in Bloemfontein.
- Outbreak in the WC. Fanciers need to adhere to the SANPO constitution.
- Paramyxovirus and Avian Influenza Virus is two different things. (Voëlgriep en Paramyxo)
- Paramyxovirus: PMV1 virus is closely related to the Newcastle disease virus. (NDV)
- PMV1 virus Specific to pigeons. Newcastle disease virus Specific to chickens.
- Could cross infect. Chickens can get PMV1 and pigeons can get NDV.
- Immunity not very strong.
- If vaccinated with the PMV1, can get a little protection against NDV and vice versa.
- La Sota virus is a live virus containing the specified La Sota strain of the NDV and this is not adequate vaccination for any pigeon.
- Only way La Sota will assist / work is when with the use of a droplet once a month in the eyes.
- This is not acceptable for SANPO Only a booster.
- Effectively need to vaccinate with PMV1 and NDV.
- Recommendation is to vaccinate babies 21 24 days.
- Adult birds will transfer immunity to babies. Adult breeding birds also needs to be vaccinated properly.
- When weaning babies, it put them under severe stress.
- If not vaccinated at 21 days, the pigeon will get a sub clinical form of virus which is very dangerous and serious. This will result in a bad season. (kidney and brain will be affected)
- Normal pigeon not under stress will not show any signs.
- These pigeons will be pre-disposed to other viruses. (YBD)
- Recommendation: Need to vaccinate breeding stock at least four weeks before coupling them. Babies in nest NDC or PMV1.
- Currently only Nobilus (PMV1) and Talovac 105 registered in SA.
- Use Nobilus PMV1 at 21 days and later single strain NDV vaccination. Need to repack in a smaller bottle by pharmacist.
- ❖ Then again vaccinate 4 6 weeks before tossing. PMV1 or combination.
- Inactivated chicken vaccination is the only vaccination required by government/law.
- Used Nobilus ND Broiler emulsion in the WC.
- Forms on pigeon trucks: Paramyxovirus, NDV and Pox.
- Tip: Weaning babies first is a weaning loft, not a young bird loft. Two weeks in a weaning loft.
- Don't have any vaccination and do not vaccinate against Avian Influenza.
